

Parent Voice feedback

Wednesday 20th September 2023



This first parent coffee morning of 23/24 was well attended by parents that represented a range of year groups. The main area of focus was the school's approach to behaviour. Details of this were shared through a presentation from Mr Broad (Executive Headteacher) and Ms Gregory (Deputy Headteacher - Inclusion) with parents and included an opportunity for parents in attendance to ask questions of the school and provide feedback.

Parent feedback is important to the school and informs future actions for the school and school leaders. Equally, knowing and celebrating what is working well helps us to identify this and ensure these aspects continue or are expanded.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Parents thanked school leaders for such a detailed presentation. Parents commented that they liked that any incident of behavior was used as a learning opportunity. Parents like the nurture based approach. It was interesting to hear about the restorative approach (video) and how it helps children to understand their behaviour choices. It was reassuring to parents that the school does not tolerate bullying but is not naive that it can happen in any school but, what matters is, how the school addresses it. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> One parent made reference to individual reports of immature/inappropriate behaviour in the lower school toilets and on the playground climbing frame and asked how the school could address this.
<p>General comments: Overall, it was a supportive session and parents responded positively to the school's behaviour approach. Parents stated that it would be helpful to share the way that staff are trained to address any incidents of undesirable behaviour with a wider audience of parents so parents can use the same approach at home.</p>
