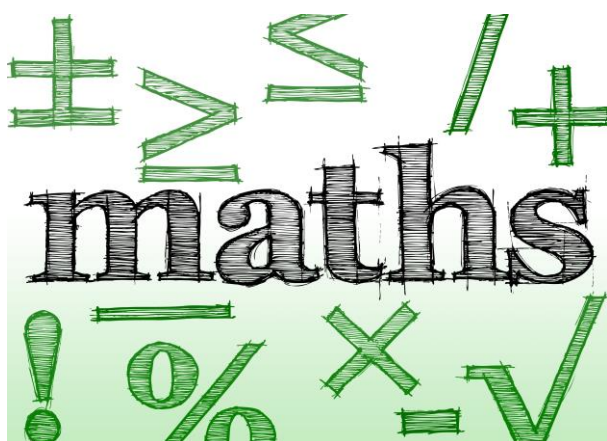

Maths Master Class

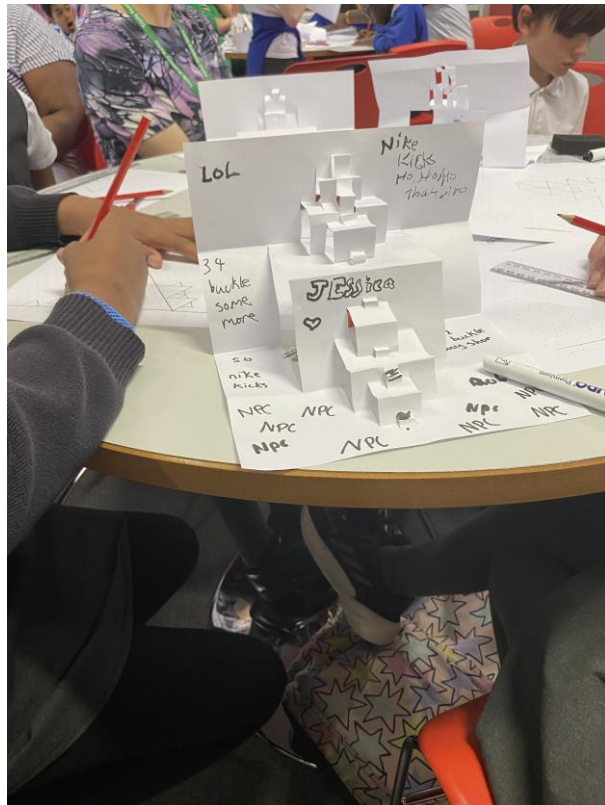
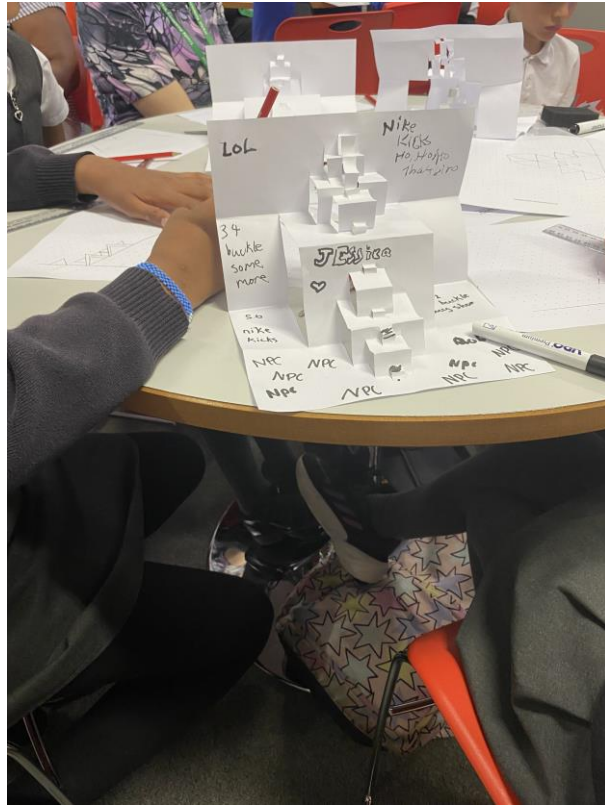


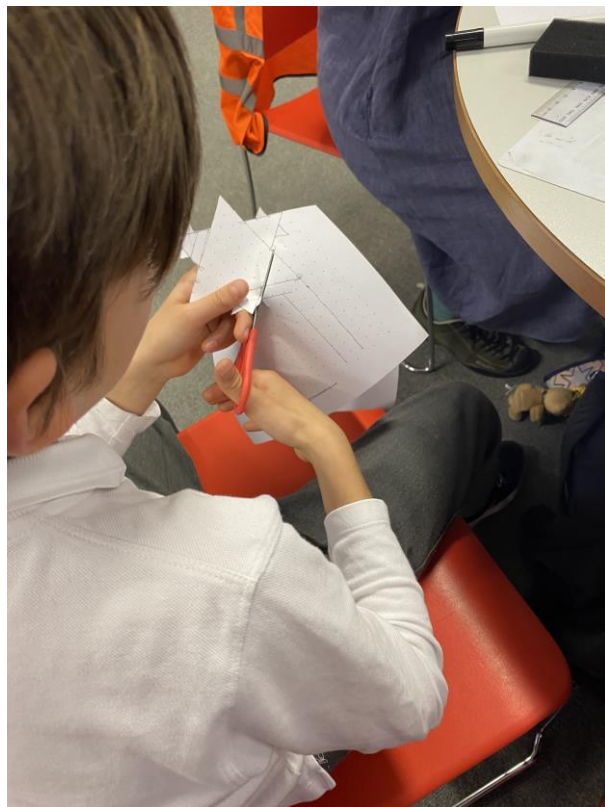
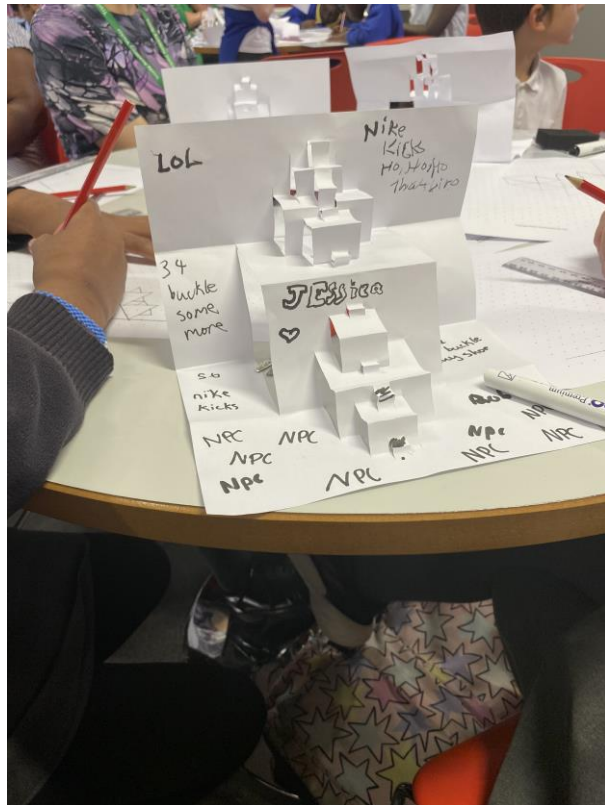

Windrush



We celebrated Windrush 75 on June 23 2023, with great enthusiasm and pride. It was a memorable day, that brought our children together to commemorate the important historical event and the contributions of the Windrush generation. The day was filled with insightful activities and special guests that made it an unforgettable experience for all involved.

One of the highlights of the day was the visit from the esteemed author, Kandace Chimbiri. Kandace, known for her remarkable work, "The Story of the Windrush," captivated our children with her storytelling skills and deep knowledge of the Windrush generation. She shared her life story, and how her parents are part of the Windrush generation - this captivated and inspired the children to appreciate the struggles, triumphs, and resilience of those who embarked on the HMT Empire Windrush. The interactive session provided a unique opportunity for our children to engage with the author and gain a deeper understanding of this significant period in history. In addition to Kandace Chimbiri's visit, we were honoured to welcome representatives from the Imperial War Museum.

Throughout the day, our students participated in a variety of activities designed to immerse them in the world of the Windrush generation. Phase 1 imagined they were part of the Windrush journey and had to decide which items they would bring with them. This sparked meaningful discussions about the importance of personal belongings and what they symbolise in times of transition and change.

Phase 2 were tasked with writing a letter back home as if they embarked on the journey. Drawing inspiration from the letters and correspondence exchanged by the Windrush generation, our students poured their hearts onto paper, sharing their thoughts, hopes, and dreams with their loved ones.

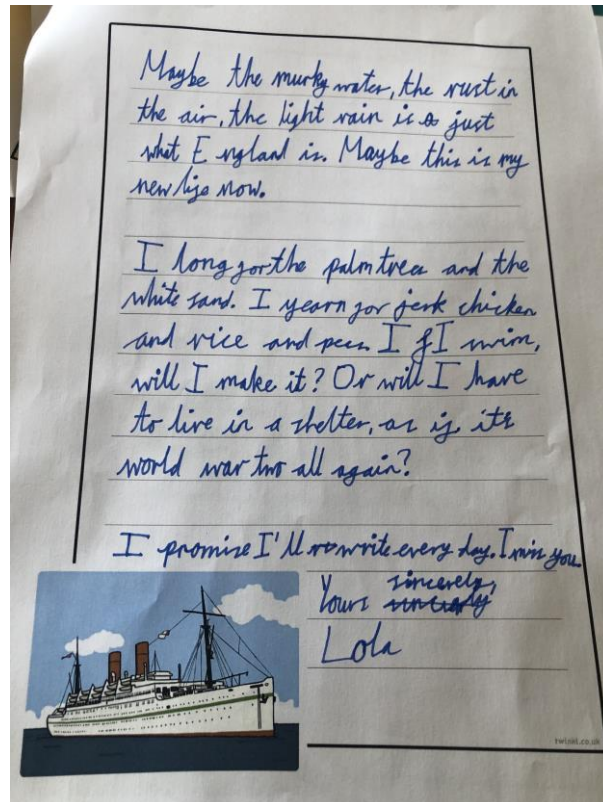
The children in Phase 3 participated in a collage-making activity using images from Kandace Chimbiri's book. Guided by their imagination, they created visually stunning collages that depicted

scenes, emotions, and themes from the book. This hands-on activity allowed our children to express their understanding of the Windrush journey in a unique and artistic way.

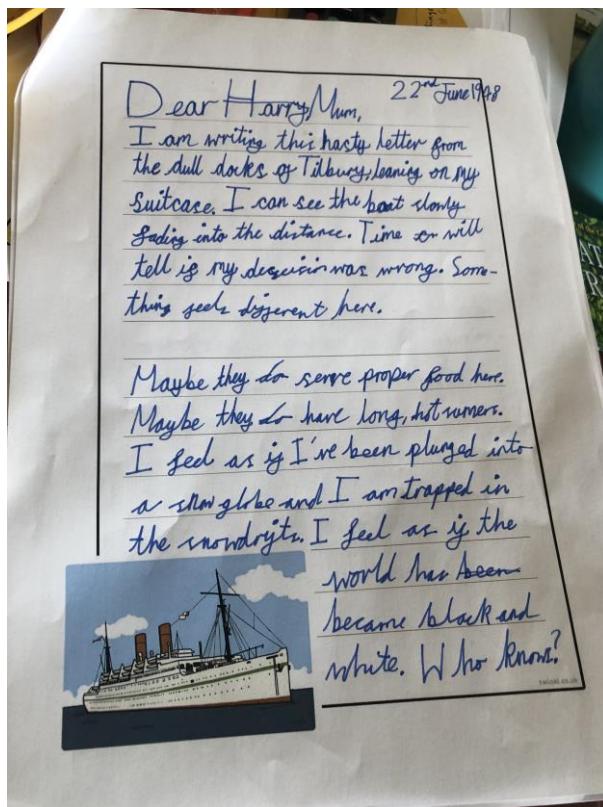
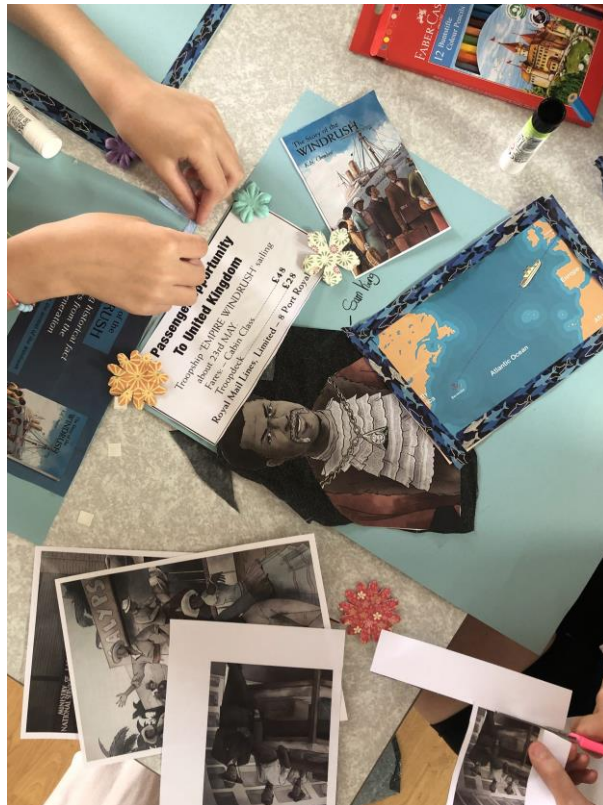
The Imperial War Museum (IWM) London will be selecting pieces of work and digitising them into a poster, which will be displayed in the Museum for all to see!

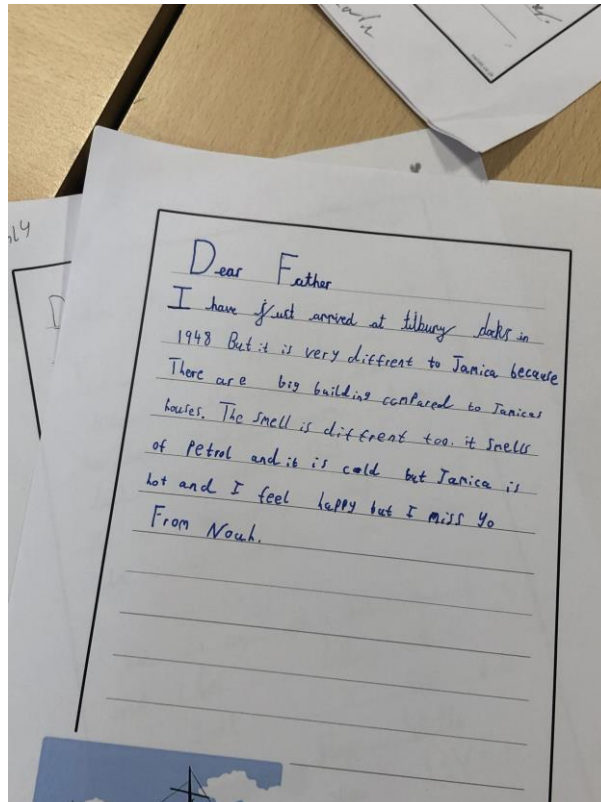
The activities continue over the Summer to mark the Windrush 75 at the IWM. Sam King's son will be making a presentation this Saturday 24th June 2023.

As a school, we acknowledge and truly appreciate the contributions that the Windrush generation provided to Britain post the Second World War.

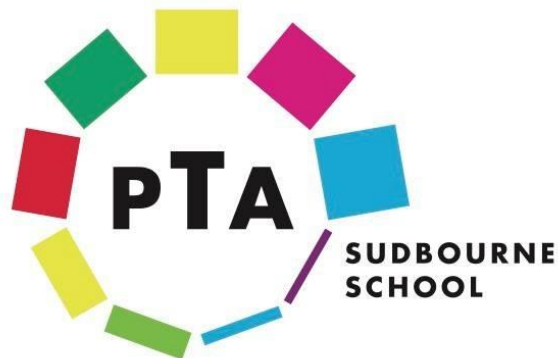

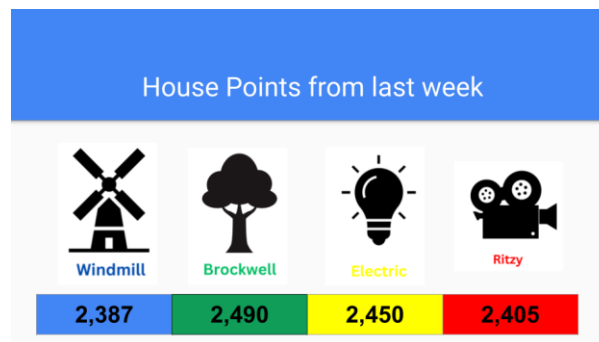
