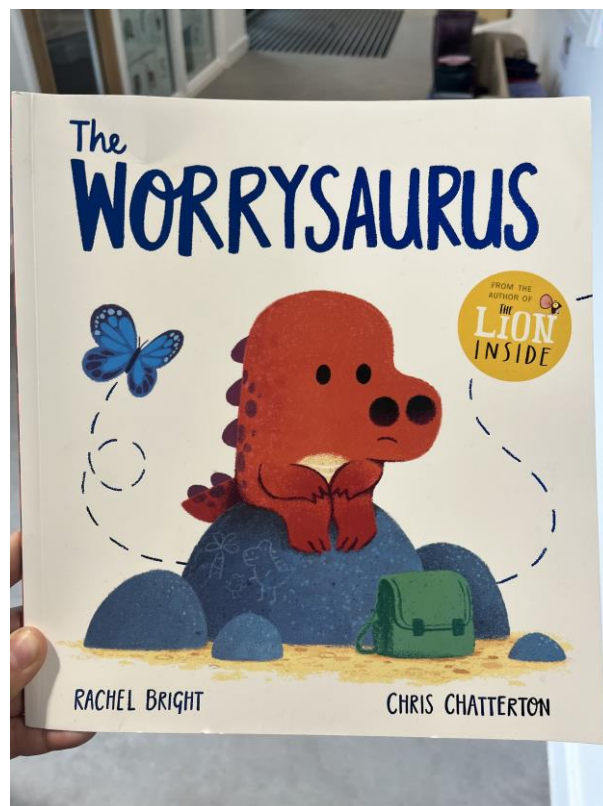
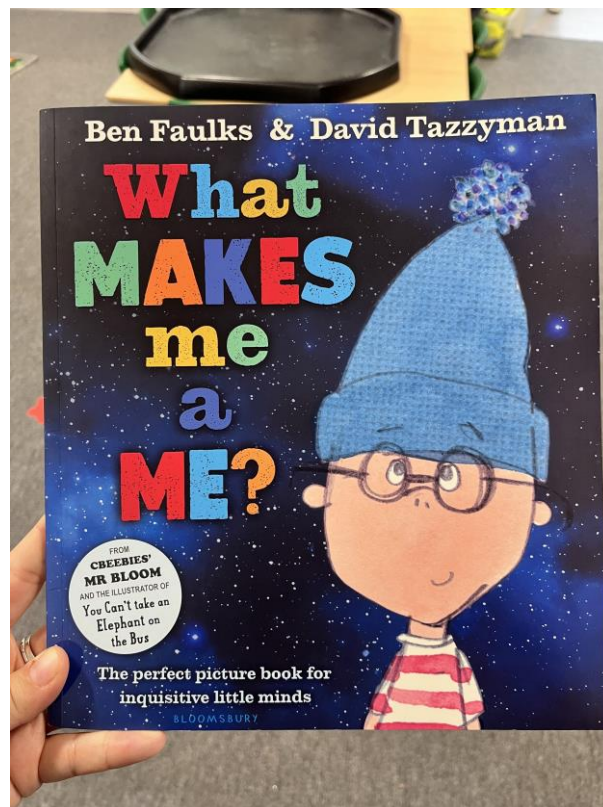

Have a look at these wonderful pieces of art from Kemiyah, Lara, Mya and Jessica in Morpurgo.

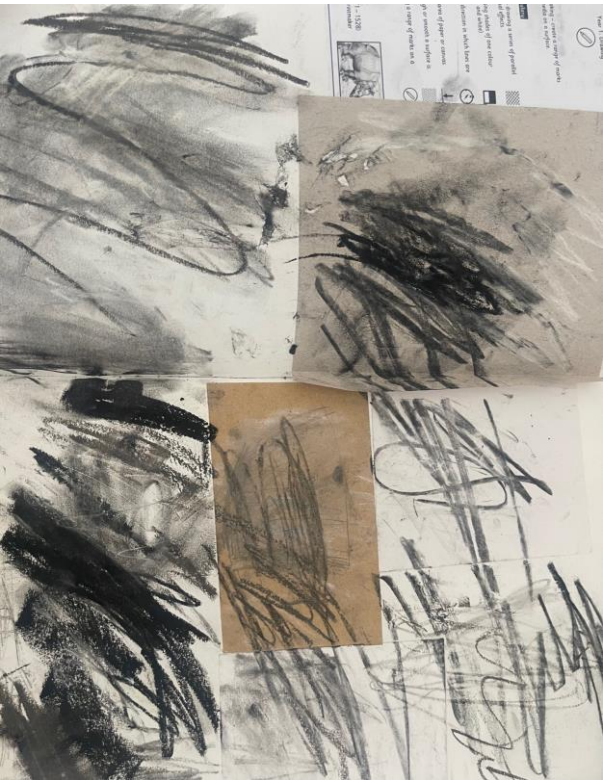
They have been practising cross hatching, smudging and using different amounts of pressure to create different tones.

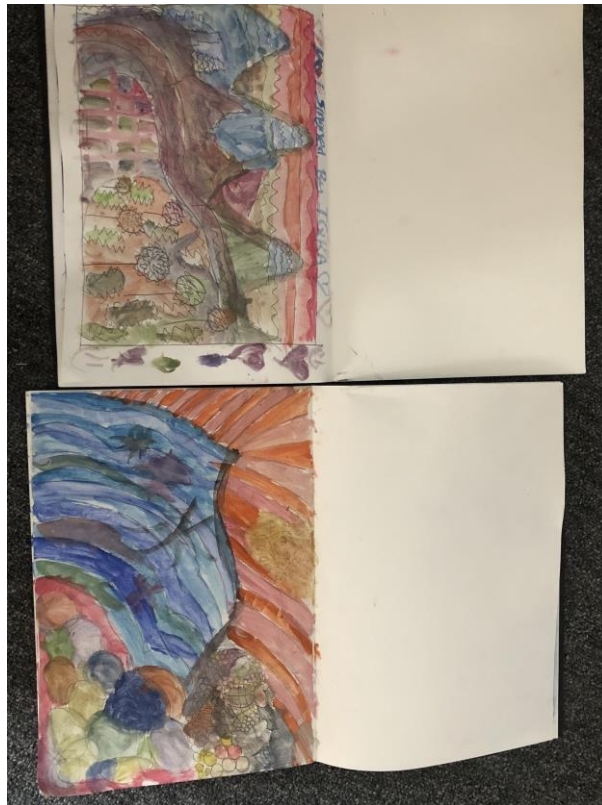

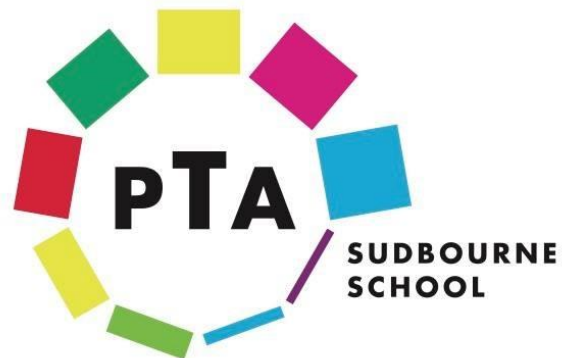
