UPDATE FROM GOVERNORS PROPOSED SCHOOL EXPANSION

Thanks to everyone who attended the proposed school expansion consultation in July - the feedback was very overwhelming positive. As previously communicated, the proposed expansion would enable Sudbourne School to expand from the current 1.5 form entry school to a 3 form entry school over two sites. This would mean that we would be able to admit 90 children in each year group instead of the current 45. Eventually, Sudbourne School would be able to accommodate 630 pupils from Reception up to Year 6 - the school would build up with an increased intake in Reception year by year. The infants would remain on the current Sudbourne Road site and the juniors would be on the Mandrell road site - there would be no need for infants to decant to the Mandrell Road junior school site as originally envisaged. The senior leadership team and governors are meeting regularly with the Lambeth project manager and the architects to discuss the programme and the finance department to discuss the growth and split site funding available to Sudbourne during expansion. Lambeth is working towards the following timelines:

- early November 2018: submit the planning application
 - mid November 2018: demolish old school on the Mandrell Road site
 - mid November 2018: issue tender information
 - early February 2019: planning decision due
 - July/August 2019 and or 2020: perform works on Sudbourne Road site to create a new nursery entrance on Sudbourne road and re-do the entrance on Hayter Road
 - September 2020: the new Mandrell Road junior school site to be ready for juniors
- Our next meeting with Cathy Twist, the Lambeth Director of Education, Learning and Skills is scheduled for early November. We will continue to provide updates in school newsletters - please email us on governors@sudbourne.com if you have any questions.

It's not a big commitment, and it's so much fun to work with the children! We do need all classes to produce each a beautiful image.

Typically a group of about 2,3, or 4 parents liaise with your class teacher directly (who will be familiar with the calendar) and find a convenient time to go into school. You will need around 45 mins to 1 hour at school, and some time to prepare with your own team beforehand (over tea or coffee?).
