CHILDCARE SUFFICIENCY ASSESSMENT

Lambeth Families Information Service is currently undertaking a Childcare Sufficiency Assessment (CSA) across the London Borough of Lambeth. The CSA is an opportunity to gather feedback from providers and parents alike regarding the childcare offers available across the borough for 0–14 year olds.

Taking part in this survey is really important since having sufficient childcare means that families are able to find childcare that meets their child's learning needs and enables parents/carers to make real choices about work and training. **The closing date for the parents/carers survey is the 17 December 2018.**

PRESCRIBED MEDICINES HELD ON THE SCHOOL PREMISES

Accessibility

At our accessible performances, an Access Assistant will be there to greet you and help as required during your visit.

Our relaxed performances are open to everyone, but are designed for people with autism, learning difficulties or other sensory and communication needs who require a more relaxed theatre environment. As well as reducing the sound and light levels of the performance, we also offer a range of services to support you throughout your trip. Prior to your visit we offer free Visual Stories, sent out by post if requested and available online, and a chill-out room will be open should you require a quiet space before, during and after the show. The building is fully wheelchair accessible. Assistance dogs are very welcome at the theatre, and will be looked after by our box office team during the performance. Please call or email the Box Office if you require a wheelchair space or have any additional requirements.

GATWICK AIRPORT

Gatwick airport recently opened the UK's first airport Sensory Room in the North Terminal and it is designed specifically for people with autism, dementia, cognitive impairment or other special needs. It is free for all passengers departing from the airport. Each sessions last 45 minutes.

Gatwick also offer a Lanyard for families where there is hidden disabilities, wearing the Lanyard will help staff identify and understand that you or a family member has a hidden disability. However, as each person's needs are individual it's important that you

tell a member of staff the support and help you will need. Some of the support you may access is, wheelchairs, lift's or buggy's, not queuing in the airport restaurants, possible quicker access through passport control, support boarding the aeroplane (getting on first or last).
