Saturday 16th March 11am – 1.30pm – fluid story telling

Visit the Archive for a morning of story-building workshops for children and families hosted by Camberwell College second year BA Illustration students Olivia Cheung, Chloe Green, Danielle Murphy, Lucy Osborne, Alyssa Stephens and Karen Zvorc. Visitors will be taken on a creative journey through south London in a series of short workshops. Try your hand at making a zine, draw what Peckham would look like if it was a planet and create south London-inspired treasure maps.

Saturday 16th March 2.30 – 4pm – stories on screen

Join us in the Archive for an afternoon of animated films set in locations across south London. Second year BA Illustration students present a series of short, animated films which showcase their research into the social, political, mythological and architectural histories of south London. Over the course of the afternoon the films will explore the histories of Camberwell Fair, the Streatham Common Rookery, the Cinema Museum, Tooting Bec, the London Sewing Machine Museum and Brockwell Lido. The screenings will also highlight the mythical histories of the local area, from the hauntings of the white lady of Camberwell to the spectre of Spring-heeled Jack.

Sunday 17th March 11am – 1.30pm – Uncovering the mysteries of South London

Visit the Archive for a morning of interactive installations and family friendly workshops hosted by Camberwell College second year BA Illustration students Hellie Cartledge and Mackenzie Hall, Harry Murphy and Emma Sielaff. Find out more about the secret histories of south London, including the story of Hartley's Jam Factory, the legacy of Sybil Phoenix and an attempt to recreate an impressive world record from 1906.
