As we draw to towards the end of term, I would like to highlight the following;

Uniform / Winter suitable clothing


Phase 1


Phase 1 has been incredibly busy the last few weeks of term! In English, children have been learning and discussing all things about character creation. We have been focusing on using expanded noun phrases (two adjectives and a noun) and using adjectives to paint a picture for a reader.

In Art lessons, we has been testing our patience through practicing weaving and creating sliders. Next week, we will be creating our very own greeting card using our knowledge of sliders - I wonder who your child will give their card too?

In Science, we have been learning about the seasons and talking about how day turns into night. We all imagined a world where night didn't exist and came to the conclusion that we are very happy for the Earth to be spinning so we can have some rest!

Finally, Phase 1 wanted to send a special welcome to the new students that have joined us recently. We are so happy to have you in our community!





Phase 2

Over the last fortnight, Phase 2 has delved deep into the Neolithic period of the stone age, identifying changes that occurred during this period; such as changing their lifestyle and beginning to farm. We are beginning to look at first person narrative key features in English, which will enable us to create our own story in the coming lessons.

In Computing, we have looked at how a computer works and played games to help us understand the intricate processes involved.

Phase 3

In History, Phase 3 have been learning about Ancient Greece and the rivalry between Athens and Sparta. The children were challenged to answer questions in character as either a Spartan or an Anthenian, and the rest of the class had to work out which city state they came from.

We would like to say a huge well done to all classes, who have now completed their first sharing assemblies.



Music Department



This year, we have welcomed a brand new music department with the addition of our new music teacher, Mr. Mather. Each class now receives weekly music lessons covering the foundations in music and instruments to the history of music over the past 1000 years.


On top of that, we have two singing assemblies per week (these are split into phases) learning songs from around the world and in all styles of music. Hopefully, you might have heard some of the songs at home!

Why not register your children with us in case you need to book in a hurry. This would make the process much quicker and there's no fee.






