Welcome back to the first newsletter of the second half of Autumn term.

It certainly feels like Autumn with the clocks going back and the change in weather. A reminder to ensure that your child wears appropriate clothing and shoes daily. If your child comes in with wellies, please ensure school shoes are also packed. A gentle reminder that school uniform requires children to wear a Sudbourne logo jumper and not a hoodie.

As you will have seen scaffolding and a skip have been placed in the playground. This is due to the works being carried out on the MUGA to repair the leak in the hall roof. We estimate that this work should take approximately two weeks to complete but is obviously dependent on the weather. Children have been informed about how to stay safe around the scaffolding and the premises team and contractors have their safety at the forefront of all works being carried out.



and is not. Next week, we will begin to look at classifications of animals. Here is some amazing science work by Morpurgo class.


In English, we have been learning about poetry and rhyming words. We have been writing poems about the seasons. Maybe you could make one together at home.


In Art lessons, Phase 1 has been painting! We were making shapes and learning about primary colours. Look at some of the amazing artwork from Bejanmin class.
















Phase 2

"Could my mum bring me here on the weekend?" Caleb Hillary Class














Phase 3

The week before half term, Ms Patton and Ms Henry took a Netball team to compete in a competition with 4 opposing Lambeth schools.


