Dear Parents/Carers,


As we approach the festive season, we have begun to think about our Nativity performance on the 15th of December.

Parliament Visit

On Friday the 10th November, three Phase 3 pupils visited Portcullis House on Victoria Embankment right next the House of Parliament. They were invited to take part in a Children's right inquiry.

The event was led by Lynk Up Crew (LUC) who are aged 7-15yrs and are young advisers to the Mayor of London. Its members contribute to shaping policy and represent the often-unheard voices of young Londoners.

The inquiry was focused around the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), in particular Article 12 – respect the view of the child and Article 13 – freedom of expression. The purpose of this Inquiry was to try and find ways to improve children and young people's lives, fact find and highlight the great work going on, in and around London. This year particularly focus was on the topics Environment & Climate, Racism & Discrimination and Mental Health, with the strong focus on Free School Meals and its significance to a child's wellbeing.

Here is what our pupils said;

'It was engaging, fun and a really thrilling opportunity to make a difference. I learnt many things, such as the effect of environmental racism and the downsides of deforestation'

'An amazing educational trip, with several astounding speeches. I have too many inspirational quotes to write down! We learnt how we can eradicate our World's flaws and keep problems to a minimum'

'We learnt a lot way to get involved and join in campaigns to end things like racism. It was interesting to hear about children's mental health and the desire for everyone to have free school meals'









Remembrance Day

In a heart-warming display of unity, our entire school came together to honour and commemorate Remembrance Day. It was a poignant and meaningful event that allowed us to reflect on the sacrifices made by brave individuals, who have fought in wars to secure freedom.

One of the highlights of our Remembrance Day commemoration, was the creation of a beautiful display featuring peace hands. An image of each child's hands with a hand painted poppy, served as a symbol of appreciation for all the men and women who have selflessly served their countries in times of conflict.



















Anti-Bullying Week

This week the children took part in Anti-Bullying week. The week started with children participating in national Odd Socks Day, where we celebrated individuality. The children also discussed the definition of bullying during the anti bullying assembly - the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group because of their race, gender, class, religion, appearance or disability. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can happen face-to-face or online.

Of course, we won't like everyone and we don't always agree, but the Sudbourne message is to choose respect. This Anti-Bullying week we had discussions about what bullying means to us, how banter can turn into something more hurtful, and what we can do to stop bullying. Together, we can make a difference and take a stand against bullying.

The House Captains ran their first, 'Anti-Bullying clinic,' at lunchtime, where pupils were invited to discuss any incidents of bullying of behaviour causing concern with the presence of a member of Leadership and Management Team.

Join us with making a noise about bullying, please encourage your child to speak to a member of staff, if they have any concerns.
















Diwali

Live music from Kisstory and Sweetboyz DJ – Morris Tolaram, who will be playing music to celebrate the diverse musical contributions of black artists both past and present.


A full bar available throughout the event.


Clear up and end time - 7:00PM
