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Executive Headteacher Comment

Welcome to the second edition of our new look newsletter. Thank you to those of you who have shared such positive feedback on this new approach. I am confident it will be a relevant source of information and help keep you updated with all aspects of school life at Sudbourne.

This week, I wanted to share the positive news that we have had an overwhelming 54 first place preferences for entry to Reception in September 2023 and a total of 150 applications. With a cohort of 45, this means we are significantly oversubscribed. We have been working hard in school to offer a range of open mornings to prospective parents and also individual parents tours. The feedback received has been very positive and the children have been a credit to the school during these tours. Prospective parents often comment on how calm the school is and how well behaved and focused the children are in the classrooms. Well done to all involved.

On the subject of pupil intake, it has now been confirmed that the PAN (Published Admission Number) for Sudbourne Primary will change from September 2024 to 30 children per Reception entry. The PAN of 30 will then progress through the school in subsequent years. This followed a request by school leaders and the Governing Body to Lambeth. Over time, this will provide a number of spare learning spaces as we will not require as many classrooms. The teachers and I have some exciting plans of what these spaces could be used for (i.e. music room, primary science laboratory or an art room). We will keep you informed in the coming years about these exciting plans.

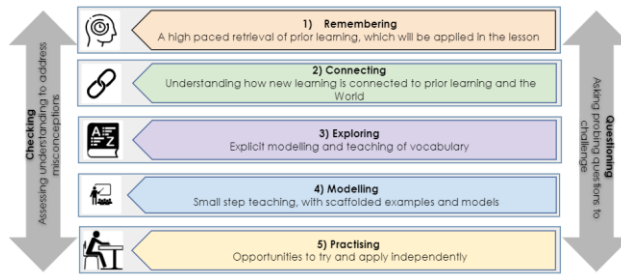

House Launch Day

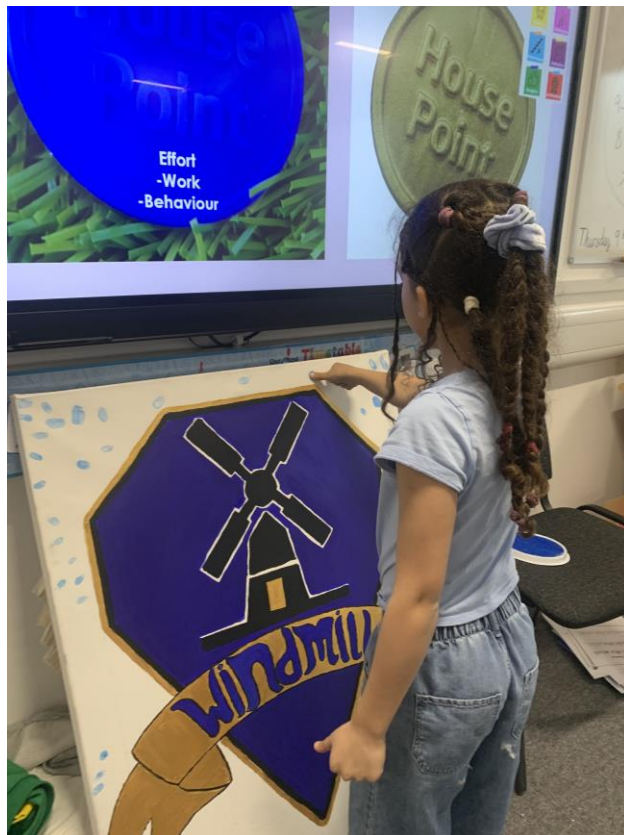
